A Note from Our President

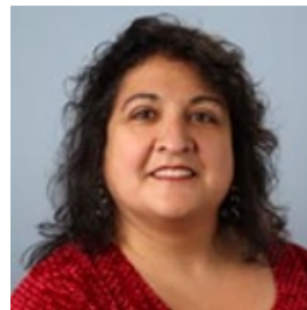
Greetings Fellow NCCCLA Members!

Jenny Thomas, Information Technology Librarian, Randolph Community College

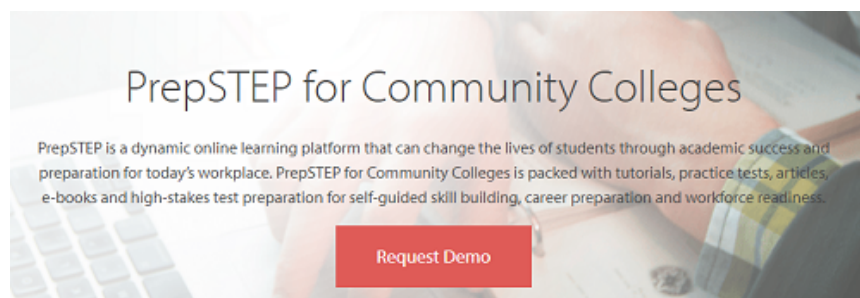
