
BRCC Library: A History

Many more seating/lounge areas than current-day (hoping to change)




What we were dealing with 2008-2017


New Carpet and a new layout for Reference & Stacks - Paid for by Facilities budget/FCAP process

Learn the disposal process for furniture/assets at your college


Clearing out clutter and organizing can make a big impact for staff, if not immediately visible to patrons
