News from the Field

Project Information Literacy (PIL) has released their 10th study looking at today's college students and their news engagement practices.

In this yearlong, comprehensive study, commissioned by the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation and the Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL), PIL surveyed nearly 6,000 students from 11 colleges and universities from across the country, and conducted follow-up interviews with 37 respondents who had completed the survey. A computational analysis of Twitter data from survey respondents (N=735) and a larger Twitter panel of more than 135,000 college-age persons provided observational and external comparative data to help frame the survey results.

Here you will find the main research report, "How students engage with news: Five takeaways for educators, journalists, and librarians" (53 pages), executive summary (2 pages), public survey dataset, survey instrument, codebook with survey responses, user the guide for the public survey dataset, press release, and findings video (2:35 minutes).

The findings suggest young adults believe news is valuable to their lives and to society on the whole, and many see themselves as active participants in its dissemination. Yet, the new digital environment and current political reality has made successful navigation extremely difficult.
