Community College Library News

The **Nash Community College Library** received a \$3,250.00 grant from UNC World View to purchase books that will support education and research for students in the college's Global Perspective Scholars Program. These books cover three geographical regions; Asia, Europe, and Latin American. Associate Library Director Robert James also received a stipend to develop LibGuides for these regions. UNC World View is a public service program based on the campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill that serves K-12 and community college educators with global knowledge, best practices, and resources to engage students in an interconnected and diverse world.

The State Library of NC's Community Connections Grant was awarded to two community colleges. **Cape Fear**'s program, Get Graphic with CFCC, provides a pair of engaging reading and discussion activities centered around graphic novels with early college high school students. **Wake Tech**'s Health Science Campus event will promote stress-reduction and relaxation through mindfulness and yoga techniques provided by an industry leader, while highlighting mindfulness resources available in the library. 
