**Randolph Community College** created a book-o-lantern for Halloween!

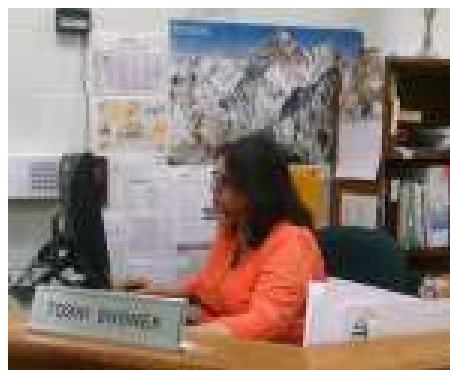
And Jane Austen's Emma visited **Wake Technical Community College's** Western Campus.

## Events and Professional Development

**Artstor** and **JSTOR** are having a two-part webinar series on navigating copyright. The November 14 session will include an explanation of Public Domain law and a demonstration of Copyright Checkpoint, a new and open tool that enables you to check the copyright status of any image or text. The November 21 session will focus on copyright in the Artstor Digital Library, including Artstor's publicly available collections.

The webinars are designed for both collection managers as well as librarians working directly with students and faculty. We welcome you to register, even if you can't attend live; recording links will be sent to all registrants after the session.

Copyright is complicated. But we're here to help! Marcie Kaufman, Counsel at ITHAKA, will discuss how US law determines whether a work is in copyright or in the Public Domain. She will also give an overview of the history of US copyright law and its resulting complexities for today's

users, and discuss tools for helping users determine the copyright status of images, books, journals, and other textual materials. This will include Copyright Checkpoint (beta), a new tool from Artstor that helps institutions and users check the copyright of any images and text.
