
Carnegie Library: Classical Design.

Golden Age of the American public library system.

Carnegie paid to build 1,795 libraries in the U.S. between 1883 and 1929.

His designs were the DNA for nearly every American library built before the end of World War II.

Athens Regional Library bookmobile (funded in part by the WPA, as noted on the car door), 1944.


Digital Library of Georgia.

Resurgence of bookmobiles


