## **A Note from Our President**

Greetings NCCCLA members,

I hope you, your families, and libraries are all thriving.

The NCCCLA Executive Board has been busy at work this summer on a series of projects including a summer webinar series, Joel Ferdon and Alan Unsworth have been exploring an eBook consortia with Overdrive, and we have been reviewing and revising the NCCCLA handbook and job position descriptions.

Over the course of last year and the experience of the conference, it was suggested that the role of Treasurer and the Membership position needed to be revised especially since we have taken the majority of the membership to an online platform of Memberplanet. With the guidance of our current Treasurer, Membership, and Procedures

officers we have revised the two positions. The current Executive Board also endorsed these changes and now we are sharing them with you, our membership. The most noteworthy change is that we have altered the Treasurer job description to include a Treasurer-elect. This person will shadow the current Treasurer during his/her last year. The Treasurer-elect will officially become the new treasurer at the next annual conference. It is our hope that the year of overlap will facilitate an easier transition. Our Treasurer position is one of our biggest roles and we often have a hard time recruiting volunteers. We hope that this year of training will encourage others to volunteer and learn from their predecessor.

When revising these positions we had to review the bylaws and found that a change is required in Article 2 Number 1. We would like to change one sentence from, "The Treasurer will be elected for a three year term or until a successor is elected." to "The Treasurer-elect will be elected for a year of shadowing and then will serve their 3 year term. We are required to inform you of these changes and then will be reaching out to you in the next newsletter asking you to vote on the changes to make the changes official or not.

#### **Sick of COVID-19?**


