FEATURED ARTICLE

Encouraging Minority Male Empowerment through Literacy Programming

Recognizing the need to support the academic interest of minority men at Pitt Community College, Brittany Champion, Instruction and Outreach Librarian, and Darrick Mullins, the <u>Minority Male Success Initiative</u> Advisor and Head Men's Basketball Coach, piloted the series Real Chat Conversations in the spring of 2021.

As quoted from Pitt Community College website, "The Minority Male Success Initiative platform promotes student inclusion for minority males. Those affiliated with the program can expect the minimization of barriers and issues and providing avenues to leadership development, academic enhancement, and achieving educational outcomes at Pitt Community College." Champion and Mullins believed participants would benefit from reading titles focused on areas that these young men are battling, thus giving them a wider perspective on how to handle matters.

Readers meet monthly to discuss award-winning titles. Initially, readers read non-fiction titles that centered around social justice, overcoming racial tensions, and establishing financial literacy. While engagement is great, facilitators felt it would be stronger if they explored fiction titles, including graphic novels and comics. In an effort to improve relatability, Champion began to seek assistance from minority male librarians and community members to facilitate programs. She recognized the need to have these young men hear from others who looked like them and possibly faced similar challenges. Marcellaus Joiner (High Point Public Library), Carlos Grooms (North Carolina A&T University) and Latis Burnett (Pitt Community College), Kenneth Joyner (Clinical Social Worker/Therapist), and Redemption Six immediately jumped at the opportunity to be of service. In addition to programs, readers can visit the Real Chat Conversations LibGuide and also interact with the book display.

As the series continues, facilitators hope to expand beyond the library and integrate into the classrooms to model community reads. In an effort to improve academic interests, foster a love for reading, and empower young minority men to read beyond their interests, facilitators will continue to meet readers where they are.
