The Library at Surry Community College is located on the first floor of the R building on the main campus in Dobson, NC. The Deborah Friedman building houses the Academic Support Center, the Scanning Room, the Archives, and the Carlos Surrat Genealogy Room as well as the Library for the college.


The first floor is home to the Circulation/Reference desk as well as an office for Technology Support. Three full-time staff, as well as numerous part-time employees, handle library services, technology questions, and archives and genealogy questions. The genealogy room is very popular in the summer with visitors from all over the country. The Student Success Librarian handles most reference questions and services in the office on the first floor.

The Library has over 25 computers for student use as well as printers, copiers, and scanners. Multiple attractive seating areas are very popular with the students as well as private rooms for study groups upstairs and downstairs. The Library is open from 7:30 until 9:00 pm Monday through Thursday and from 7:30 until 2:30 pm on Fridays.


Durham Tech CC Library Chosen for TAP

The N.C. State Historical Records Advisory Board has selected Durham Technical Community College Library as a 2022 participant in the Traveling Archivist Program (TAP). A team of archivists from the State Archives and partner institutions will serve six organizations this year with virtual consultations, on-site training, and supplies to improve preservation and access for document, photograph, and/or film collections. The TAP program is supported with federal funds from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission. TAP's purpose is to help repositories improve preservation and access for archival collections. Library Director Julie Humphrey, Reference Librarian Alexandra Deyneka, and Library Technician Lorell Butler will serve as partners in this project.









The Durham Technical Community College Archive documents and preserves the history of the college, its leaders, employees, students, and its role within the local community. The college was founded in 1961 as the Durham Industrial Education Center. As our college celebrates its 60th anniversary, we understand our vital role in Durham's history. The Library's Archive collects and houses college publications, yearbooks, course catalogs, photographs, newspaper articles, bulletins, newsletters, media, marketing materials, ephemeral items, and related materials. We hope to make these materials more accessible to our college and local communities through finding aids, digitization, and marketing.
