FEATURED LIBRARY: GERALD B. JAMES LIBRARY, ROCKINGHAM CC

The Gerald B. James Library lies at the center of the pastoral campus of Rockingham Community College in Wentworth, NC. Wentworth is in the center of the county, between the population centers of Reidsville, Eden, and Madison. Built in 1967, the mid-century modern building was designed by noted architect Leslie Boney. The interior underwent major renovations in 2018, removing large sections of shelving and returning the floorplan to the light, bright, open space it was originally intended to be.

The library also includes the Rockingham County Historical Collections. When the RCHC was established about 40 years ago, no one in Rockingham County was collecting and preserving information and artifacts of local historical interest. Today, the collections comprise an important part of library services. High school and college classes utilize original sources for research, and the community finds many valuable genealogical materials not available elsewhere.

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In addition to traditional library services, many events are sponsored by the library. Each semester a North Carolina author is invited to speak in the library and the campus and community are invited. Most recently, Adele Myers, author of *Tobacco Wives*, spoke at a well-attended event. Each fall the library hosts Game Night, a popular Halloween-themed event where participants play games and compete in a costume contest with prizes. Another popular library event is #JamesLibraryRocks. Library staff provide supplies and set up painting stations in the library and students are invited to paint a rock and hide it anywhere on campus. Participants hunt the painted rocks and post their finds to social media with the hashtag #JamesLibraryRocks.















Managed by the Director of Library Services and Archives, the James Library is staffed by the Public Services Librarian and the Library Technical Assistant, as well as student workers. The James Library is open Monday-Thursday from 7:45am until 6pm, and Friday from 7:45am until 3pm.

- Scholarships: Backing two scholarships for community members who pursue a degree in library science;
- Grants: Funding two grants for professional development or conference fees; and
- Operational Expenses: Covering essential administrative costs, including membership management software, website host and domain, and the Association's Zoom account



NCCCLA OER TASK FORCE UPDATES



On Friday, February 2, 2024, the Task Force hosted an online session with Dana Glauner and Shelby Beard, both of South Piedmont CC. They were invited to share how their campus uses <code>BibliU</code> to host OER and other course materials used across their curriculum. Using BibliU allows the campus to get detailed statistics on how course materials are used, lets students access all of their course materials in one place, and provides ways for students to interact with materials through highlighting, note-taking, etc.


